

Week 6: BIBLICAL SALVATION

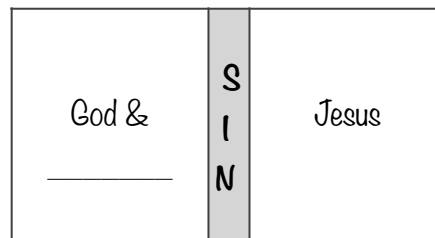
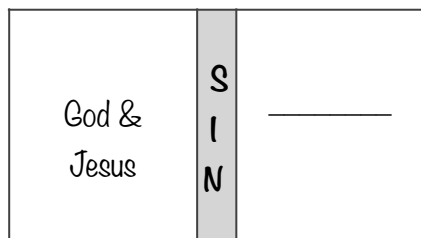
When we talk about "being saved", what do we need to be saved from?

Are you responsible?

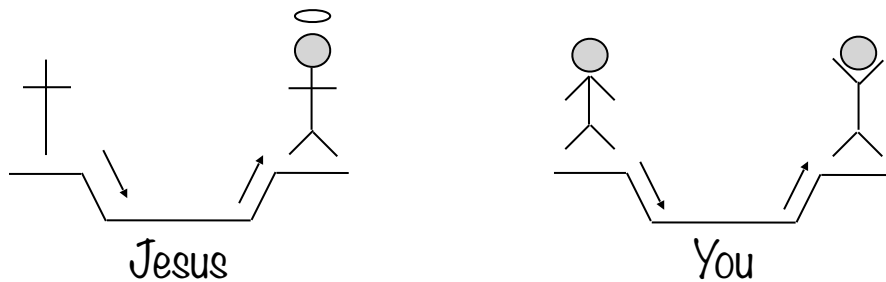
How did the people feel about crucifying Jesus?
